- Environmental Protection, Surveillance & Risk Management
- Fate of radionuclides in the environment

Abstracts (1/2 - 1 A4-page) should be sent to the conference secretariat before 8 March, stating whether oral presentation or poster is preferred.

The conference fee is 900 SEK and registration should be made to konferens@sfrek.se not later than 8 March. In the conference fee is included lunch both days, dinner on the first evening and coffee both days. Payment is made to PlusGiro account 42 79 61-8 (Svensk förening för radioekologi).

Retired participants and students doing their master thesis (exam) work pay a reduced fee (meals and coffee).

PhD-students can apply for funding for travel expenses and participation. The application should include a short description of the PhD-work and attached to the registration e-mail.
